- Qualifications:**
- A. A degree in Management or Business Administration or Law or Finance or Accounting or Computer Science or an equivalent qualification acceptable to the Authority.
- B. Candidates should –
- i. possess interpersonal and communication skills;
 - ii. be assertive, tactful and able to work under pressure;
 - iii. have a high sense of responsibility and confidentiality; and
 - iv. be computer literate
- Candidates should produce written evidence of knowledge claimed.
- Duties:** To be responsible to the Chief Gambling Regulator and Investigator for the performance of the following duties:
1. To assist the Chief Gambling Regulator and Investigator in the investigation of complaints on gambling malpractices or any contravention of the Gambling Regulatory Authority Act.
 2. To carry out inspections and investigations in accordance with guidelines and standard set by the Chief Gambling Regulator and Investigator or the Board and ensure compliance with conditions of licences/regulations.
 3. To prepare analytical reports and provide information concerning licenses/licensees, as and when required, and to follow up on all investigations.
 4. To process applications for a license or the renewal of a license for submission to Board and ensure payment of related fees and security deposits.
 5. To liaise and collaborate with the Police des Jeux, Mauritius Revenue Authority and Financial Intelligence Unit on gambling related matters.
 6. To swear affidavit and attend court cases, as and when required.

7. To inspect and monitor the conduct of gambling and casinos, lottery games, sweepstakes, pool betting, bookmakers operations, totalisator program, fixed odd betting on football matches played outside Mauritius and any other type of game related to gambling.
8. To identify the risk of problem gambling associated with gaming machines.
9. To inspect any machine and equipment and to check books records, bank statements, data captured in any form or other documents in connection with any activities licensed under this Act.
10. To examine all “Rules of Games” submitted by licensees.
11. To use ICT in the performance of his duties.
12. To perform such other duties directly related to the main duties listed above or related to the delivery of the output and results expected from the Gambling Regulator and Investigator in the roles ascribed to him.

Note

The Gambling Regulator and Investigator will be required to work outside normal working hours including Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays.
